PASSOVER: THE QUEST FOR LIBERATION: JUDAISM'S MASTER STORY AND MANDATE



By Rabbi Daniel Isaak Our travels through Myanmar gave us just the slimmest taste of what it means to live under

a repressive dictatorship. For decades the military censored any exposure to critical journalism, media or literature. Myanmar's people became terrified to speak disrespectfully of any aspect of the regime, terrified of their own relatives, neighbors or fellow citizens who might inform the authorities on them. In such an environment it is understandable that people remained vigilant not to associate with anyone who they thought might be under government suspicion. (Soon after arrival in Myanmar when we inquired about recent changes, our guide joked that our driver would be submitting to Cont. on Page 3

As we are now past the mid-point of our fiscal year (July 1 to June 30), I thought I would use this space to inform our Kehilah of how we are doing

fiscally. By way of background, for the last 2 years, our board has had to make mid-year adjustments to our budgeted expenses to balance our budget by year end. The overwhelming reason these downward expense adjustments were necessary was because our dues collections were not meeting our budgeted expectations. This fiscal year, we changed our policy for dues payments, requiring that payment other than annually or semi-annually be made Cont. on Page 5

with us. I certainly took it as a joke...In such an environment the consequences of bringing attention to oneself could be catastrophic.

Over the last 18 months several restrictions on people's freedoms have been lifted. The government has guaranteed freedom of speech, the ability to freely assemble and the publication of uncensored newsprint. Elections have taken place. Suu Kyi, the heroic spokesperson for democracy no longer under house arrest has taken her seat in the national parliament. These newly acquired freedoms are liberating and exciting to watch, emerging before our eyes in a society which has heretofore not known them. Though it is amazing how quickly matters have turned around and people exercise their new freedoms, there is understood reason for caution. The new national constitution still provides that 25% of the parliamentary seats be reserved for the military in addition to seats they acquire through the electoral process. The constitution also demands that the president come from the military. One guide confided that not until the next election in 2015 will the country discover whether the new freedoms are for real or merely a temporary aberration. Everyone knows that all that they are experiencing now can be removed in an instant. As outsiders who do not speak the native language we could not even under current circumstances determine the nuances of how free the people feel to express themselves.

Nevertheless our travels allowed us to experience the truest essence of what the festival of Passover promises. Living in America we naturally take our liberties for granted. Yet even we continue to debate the details. It is virtually impossible to imagine the fear that repressive government can instill in a human being or society as a whole. This battle for freedom is being waged not only in Myanmar, but most brutally before our eyes in Syria, as well as calling out to people in Egypt, China, Tibet, Darfur, Chechnya, Bahrain, and countless other places across the globe. Passover calls on us to support all those who struggle for freedom, to place stumbling blocks before those who would undermine it.

"In every generation every human being must see her/himself as if s/he personally came forth from Egypt."

Consequently, our dues collections this year are far ahead of where they were last year and we are on target to end our fiscal year balanced without having to make any mid-year adjustments. It helps, also, that our Kehilah responded so generously to our Annual Giving Campaign, which included our Kol Nidre Appeal. Thanks to everyone who participated in helping take care of our Kehilah.

Of course, our work in funding our operations is never done. To seal our budgetary success, we need to have a successful auction. We are confident that through the leadership of our auction chairs, Todd and Felicia Rosenthal, and their energetic committee, our Martini and Mitzvot themed auction will meet or even exceed our expectations. I look forward to not only seeing you all on March 17, but to also bidding against you to help us raise the money necessary to help take care of our Kehilah's many needs. Let's not forget that while we all look for bargains, it's admirable and encouraged to spend a little (or a lot) extra on those auction items for the benefit of our Kehilah. On another budgetary matter, as many of you know, we have quietly begun our Capital Completion Campaign to raise the \$2.5 million necessary to finish the original Capital Campaign begun 7 years ago which culminated in all of our capital improvements, including the Stampfer Chapel and the new administrative wing (which, by the way, is still looking for a name to honor). Thanks, to the generosity of so many of you, and especially our lead donors, the Holzman family, we raised \$8.1 million before we took a break for the untimely recession. Today, we are seeking to re-energize our key donors to solidify our base before approaching the entire Kehilah. Please be aware that we are working intently to solve this issue before we need to begin paying our mortgage out of our operating budget. Our goal is to raise the \$2.5 million necessary to complete the campaign before the conclusion of the next fiscal year. If we achieve this goal, we should be able to continue to provide all of the services our 900 family member Kehilah has come to expect and deserve without any interruption or decrease. WE ARE BLESSED TO HAVE A WONDERFUL VAriety of Tikkun Olam activities overseen by great leaders and supported by large numbers of our congregants. Almost all of them began as the result of the efforts of a single member who felt strongly enough about the activity to take the lead in making it happen and, over time, thrive.

What we have not done is develop an ongoing committee that looks out over the vast array of social action causes we could be involved in, prioritize them, and then take the initiative to organize our members wherever they see the most pressing need.

This is not necessarily for not trying. We simply haven't recruited a corps of folks interested in taking on that role. Our Tikkun Olam advocates seem to like to focus on doing rather than discussing and that's not bad at all!

However it does bring up another challenge, renewing and reinvigorating our committee and our ongoing activities. Over my years as chair of the committee we have reached out to literally every member who checked off interest in Tikkun Olam offering them the opportunity to sit in on a committee meeting and encouraging them to get involved in specific efforts. Many have taken us up on the involvement in individual activities only a handful came to a meeting. As a result our Tikkun Olam committee is pretty much made up of only the folks who lead our wonderful activities and it's chair finds himself without a successor when it's time to move on.

Perhaps that structure no longer serves us well. The question is whether there is a better approach? With the continued support of

Jennifer Greenberg, our staff liaison, we are now beginning an internal discussion on that question. It will start on the clergy and staff level. Your insights are welcomed. The one thing I can promise is however this evolves Neveh Shalom will continue to be a leader in Tikkun Olam efforts in the Portland Jewish community. PESACH - A NATURAL HOLIDAY

This year Pesach begins on March 25th. Rabbi Natan said that "an essential aspect of Pesach is to repair material wealth - to elevate it...from impurity to holiness." Pesach is a unique opportunity to learn to use material things in the holiest of ways. It is a time to reflect on what we have, what we want, and what we really need.

When you clean your home and rid it of chametz, check your cleaning products. Are they safe and natural, or do they contain chemicals that could harm your or your children's health? What about all those things you use in the yard? As you contemplate spring and planting and yard work, pledge to maintain your yard chemical-free. Think of the "chametz" we produce and spread throughout the natural world. Help to reduce it.

At your seder, strive to purchase as much locally-produced and organic food as possible. Think of the earth as you dip the greens and as you read the lovely prayers about spring and nature in the Haggadah, like the song of the turtle-dove. Note that the plagues were mostly natural disasters.

Then spend time to reflect outdoors. On Sunday March 31st, Shomrei Teva will lead a special Pesach nature hike. On Sunday, April 21st, join Shomrei Teva for "Yom Ha'Adamah – Earth Day" and share the mitzvah of maintaining our increasingly beautiful creekside restoration site.

Know someone who is ill and needs a visit? Perhaps you lost a love one and need a meal? Our Chesed (Loving Kindness) Committee is here for you. 




