FROM THE PULPIT



Impermanence – King Solomon and The Dalai Lama I love my work, and the days I love most are often the ones that are the busiest and

most intense. Recently one morning I joined in song with a young couple celebrating the bris of their newborn baby in their home, "Siman tov and mazal tov and mazal tov and

siman tov!" I then got in my car and drove to our cemetery to see a family I had sat with the night before listening to stories - stories that could now only be memories as we lowered their loved one into the earth while reciting our tearful sacred prayers, "A time to be born and a time to die. Adonai has given and Adonai has taken." I washed my hands at the cemetery fountain (as is the Jewish custom when leaving a cemetery), took a deep breath and made my way to officiate under a wedding chuppah at a sparkling downtown hotel. I found the bride and groom with wide eyed smiles looking towards the future and when they were finished adorning themselves with jewels and flowers I gave them the traditional blessing, "May God bless you with all the good things in life." An occupational hazard (or rather an occupational honor) of being a religious leader is that we guide people through it all. From married to buried, the highest highs and the lowest lows. And on days like these as I drive from one lifecycle to the next, I can't help but be reminded that everything in life is always changing. In fact the dynamism of life and this skillful perspective hit me like a ton of bricks, and then the realization itself changes, gone in a flash, and my mind goes back to drei (Yiddish for confusing oneself with trivial matters).

An eternal truth for all of us, however difficult to hold onto, is that everything is always changing. The rug gets pulled out from under us swiftly and slowly. The stable ground we think we stand upon will at some point be different or no longer and our footing in life finds new ground. To express this universal concern we all find ourselves saying "life is fragile!" But medical doctors will tell us that life is anything but fragile. In the words of Rachel Remen, author and physician, "Life can change abruptly and end without warning, but life is not fragile. There is a difference between impermanence and fragility...the body is an intricate design of checks and balances, with elegant strategies of survival layered upon layer...there is a tenacious will to survive present at the intracellular level." Survival is written into the very fabric of our being. Remen remembers as a medical student seeing one of her teachers put a finger in the mouth of a newborn. Once the baby took hold sucking the finger, the teacher gently lifted him off the bed held only by the finger and the strength of the baby's suck. We have a built in will to live. Life is not fragile it's just not permanent...nothing is.

The greatest of these is our financial health and the model we use to fund our operations. CNS's dues structure and the manner in which we raise funds to pay our bills must be reconciled. Our ability to project dues collection rates has suffered during the recession, and as a result, our budgeting process has failed. This year we are again likely to run a significant deficit. problem, but with dues collection rates hitting a low and an increased number of families requesting dues assistance, the Board's options have become limited. Over the last 4 years, our decisions have been framed by the 1998 Long Range Plan and our attempt to implement it. We have had successes in many areas. But it is clear that the vision of a 1200 member Congregation that provides the many religious services and educational and programming opportunities, as we do; and that is led and supported by 2 Rabbis, a Cantor, an Executive Director and professional staff is not within our budgetary capabilities at this time. Our membership today stands at about 930. Approximately 1/3 of our membership requests some form of dues assistance. And we are proud to have never turned any family away for financial reasons, and we never will. But we are living beyond our means and without the anticipated increase in paid memberships called for in the '98 plan, we cannot financially support the infrastructure we created. We must reduce our expenses. These cuts are likely to be painful, but the alternative is not acceptable. The newly adopted 2011 Long Range plan does address these issues and provides a good road map having established priorities for the allocation of our resources.

I know that with your continued support and hard work the new Board of Directors and Executive Committee will be able to solve this riddle. I thank you for all of your support during my Presidency. I am proud of the work we have done. I look forward to seeing you around the campus. **Doug Lenhoff**



According to Jewish tradition, the Ten Commandments were given to Moses on Mount Sinai on Shavout. That is why this holiday is called "Zman Matan Toratenu"—the Time of the Giving of Our Law. Shavuot, which means the Festival of Weeks, occurs seven weeks after Passover and also commemorates the early wheat harvest in Palestine. So we decorate our homes and synagogues with flowers and greens. Shavuot has still another meaning. It is the Festival of New Fruits, when each man brought the first of his barley, wheat, grapes, figs, olive oil, pomegranates, and honey to the Temple in Jerusalem. There, everyone took part in the Bikkurim (First Fruits) ceremony, which has been revived in new ways in modern Israel. Refreshments and cheesecake will be served.

peaceful mind in the midst of turmoil. Nature is the most accessible example of constant change. Flowers fade and wither and new life blooms again. And yet our conditioned tendency is to see our own selves as fixed, exempt from the natural world. By recognizing the "bigger picture" we gain a more expansive view of our own lives, and the wisdom to appreciate them unfolding.

Eastern religions claim that our frustrations, fears, and disappointments come from being too attached. We try to hold on to our expectations or set ways when the truth is that everything is changing. I remember while I was studying at UCLA, I thought it would be interesting to go see the Dalai Lama speak at Pauley Pavillion. As a Jew, I remember clearly thinking how strange it was that when he entered everyone placed their palms together seemingly in prayer, as if God himself had just entered the building. I had learned that we only make such gestures to the limitless mystery we call God, never to a human. But despite my hesitations, I did listen to what he said and one thing stuck out that I'll always remember which was quite beautiful. He said we should attempt to be like the calm water beneath the deep waves of the ocean, hearing and feeling the movement and roar above us, but living in the stillness and calm below the crashing of the waves.

When I open my Shabbos siddur I read a similar, perhaps even more ancient expression of my own Eastern (Middle) ancestors. Every Friday night we chant Psalm 93, *"The rivers may rise and rage, the waters may pound and pulsate, the floods may swirl and storm. Yet above the crash of the sea and its mighty breakers is you Adonai the Source."* The Sages of old give us instructions to view life from a vantage point that doesn't get taken away by change but rests comfortably in the awareness of its truth. And I remember it was the hero of our tradition, King Solomon/Shlomo, who is famous for commissioning a royal ring to

wear on upon his finger. He instructed his most loyal servant to engrave upon this lavish ring words that he could utter at any moment in life. He sought to look upon his ring and utter these words during his greatest celebrations as well as during his darkest nightmares. When he was the happiest he would ever be he wanted to celebrate with this ring, and when he was sobbing in tears he wanted to seek its comfort. For months on end his servant searched for the perfect phrase but found it to be an impossible task. Finally one day, King Solomon's loyal servant came to Jerusalem to the King's residence and presented him with the new royal ring. As the King placed it upon his hand he read the Hebrew letters etched upon the surface, Gam Zeh Ya'avor... This Too Shall Pass.

May we all be blessed to rest in the awareness of life's constant transformation. L'shalom

did this holiday, which originally was an agricultural event only, later become the designated day when the Jewish people received the Torah at Sinai? And what does the interrelationship of those two events mean to us in the modern world?

These are hard questions; an answer would take far more than the space allotted for this column.

The D'var Torah comes from the website for Kolel, the Adult Centre for Liberal Jewish Learning, a Jewish educational organization in Toronto.

I encourage all readers of this column to peruse the D'var Torah. It's about six times longer than this column, but it beautifully presents its ideas about Shavuot, morality, God, Judaism, science, nature, and how all are connected. I think if you read it you'll gain a much greater feeling for the importance and meaning of Shavuot. After reading it, spend some time in nature: your backyard, a park, along a river, or up at the mountain.




