FROM THE PULPIT



Where Were You 10 Years Ago Today?

An answer we will all undoubtedly recall days from now as we remember the tragic events of September 11th. This year marks the 10th anniversary of those families whose lives were forever changed. Like the assassination of Kennedy, King's "I Have A Dream" speech, Pearl Harbor and reaching the moon...who we were with and what we were doing the morning of September 11, 2001 is forever etched in our memory. Where were you? I remember vividly getting ready to leave my apartment in the Los Angeles Jewish neighborhood of Pico Robertson. I was headed to Talmud class during my first year of rabbinical school, and excited because Sarah was going to meet me for lunch that day. My roommate turned on the television while I was eating breakfast and the world has been different ever since. At rabbinical school, amidst the shock and tears and confusion, our rabbis insisted that we continue with our Talmudic studies that day.

The sages taught:

Once the Roman government decreed that the Jewish people should not engage in the study of Torah. One rabbi found Rabbi Akiva convening public assemblies engaging in the study of Torah. "Akiva! Aren't you afraid of the regime?" Rabbi Akiva replied, "I will give you a parable, to what is this situation comparable? To a fox who was walking alongside a river, and saw fish that were gathering from place to place, as they were fleeing something. The fox said to the fish, 'From what are you running away?' They told him, 'From the nets that people are bringing to catch us.' The fox said to the fish, 'Is it your wish that you come up to dry land where you will be safe from the nets, and we shall dwell together, I and you, just as my ancestors dwelt with your ancestors?' The fish said to him, 'Are you the one they describe as the cleverest of the animals? You are not a clever one but a fool! If in the climate that sustains our life we are afraid, in the climate of our death, should we not be afraid all the more so?' So too is the situation facing us: If now, as we sit and engage in the study of the Torah, about which it is written, "It is the life and the length of our days (Deuteronomy 30:20), and we are nevertheless threatened by such danger, if we proceed to absent ourselves from the Torah, we would be endangered all the more so!" (Tractate Brachot 61b)

The lesson is to hold on to what we consider most dear no matter the circumstances. Our ancestors could have stopped engaging Torah. "Torah" is interpreted through the generations as the whole corpus of Jewish study, culture and living. Torah is not limited only to the text itself. Our

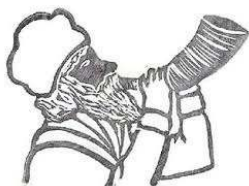
greatest grandparents could have lived out their fear and hidden from their destiny and we would not be here today. According to the rabbis of the Talmud, to leave behind a part of who we are out of fear only makes our situation more perilous, like a fish out of water.

Ten years ago a new wave of fear swept over and the challenge ever since has been to remain close to the values and ideals we hold most dear. That night after the towers fell, Sarah and I, along with many others from our Jewish community, gathered to comfort a friend whose uncle was taken from her that morning. We watched and heard on the television the heart wrenching cell phone calls made from the towers during the desperate last connection between a husband and wife, the last "I love you" between a mother and child. And that night in Los Angeles, we went out to join with thousands lining the streets with candles of hope and healing. It's a strange feeling to hold on to fear and hope at the same time: the trial is to grasp tightly on to hope. We as Jews are no strangers to holding on simultaneously to fear and hope; dreadful memory and joyful dream. It happens every year on Yom Hashoah, our day of holocaust remembrance, when Israeli fighter jets fly over Auschwitz, to remind us all that the hopes of our peoples' future will never again be muted. I watch it happen at every Jewish wedding I officiate, when in the midst of a couple's sparkly eyed future we break a glass to remember the brokenness of our history, and then we shout "Mazal Tov!" and start dancing. We hold on to our collective memories, all of them, but we hold on tighter to our destiny.

We are looking forward to seeing everyone on September 11 at our "Back To Shul" event to kickoff the new year ahead. We hope that you will come early at 2:00pm as we gather together for a memorial of hope and healing.

The Cantors Assembly had its first overseas mission trip to Poland and Israel in 2009. Along with approximately 300 other cantors and congregants from Conservative synagogues throughout the country, I was fortunate to be a participant. The cantors sang throughout the two countries—even participating in the annual international Festival of Jewish Culture in Krakow, likely the largest Jewish music gathering of its kind, attracting over 15,000 people each year. We had some amazing experiences, the most for many of us was visiting Auschwitz and Birkenau where we prayed, sang, and of course, remembered and cried together. Beyond the singing, in both countries we were offered different sightseeing tracks which allowed individuals to pursue their interests such as history, archeology, culture, food, shopping and more. During the course of the two weeks, we were followed by a professional film crew who captured footage at each area and event to build an amazing documentary entitled, *100 Voices*. A few of us from the Neveh Shalom community gathered together last fall to watch the film and engage in discussion.

Every few years, it is the intention of the Cantors Assembly to have an overseas mission like the one in 2009. The next of

these extraordinary trips is to be held June 27-July 11 of 2012: "A Musical Journey of Heritage and Healing in Germany and Israel." I am planning to lead a group from Neveh Shalom next year on this once-in-a-lifetime trip. Many of you may have roots in Germany as Rabbi Isaak does, or in Israel or both. Perhaps you simply love to travel and have not had the opportunity to visit Germany or Israel. You may be attracted by the music itself and the opportunity to sing with the cantors on the trip. As you begin to look towards the New Year and envision all of the things you'd like to experience, I hope that this adventure might be something that you will seriously consider. Harold and I encourage you discover more over the next few months and we hope you'll decide to join us!

Sample itineraries and pricing guides for the Germany/Israel mission trip will be available through the main office. There will be an opportunity to go on the full two-week excursion or just join us for the week in Germany or the week in Israel. I will hold the first informational session on the Germany/Israel trip on Wednesday, September 7th at 7:00 p.m. at Neveh Shalom. 5772: A Time to Reflect

During the High Holy Days, as we reflect on our lives with others, it's also a time to look toward the earth. How have you treated it? Have you actively tried to reduce your "environmental footprint?" Have you taught your children to care for the earth? What will you do next year as environmental concerns grow? These are valid thoughts during this most personal and holy of times.

Shomrei Teva has been active. We planted more native plants at the Creekside Restoration site on Mitzvah Day and continued to maintain the site every third Sunday. At our "Gan Tikvah" garden, we cleared the site in the lower courtyard, brought in raised beds, and planted our first vegetables! With

the Chik-Chak community we celebrated Tu b'Shvat, incorporating ritual foods with an environmentally-themed d'rash, seder activities, and music. And throughout the synagogue we continued to expand the food waste reduction program.



For next year? Expansion of the Creekside Restoration site, a more bountiful garden, Tu b'Shvat activities, continued reduction in food waste, partnership with the religious school in new activities, and celebration of nature outdoors. We, like you, will reflect during these upcoming days on what else we can do to care for our garden, our earth.

A CALL TO EASE CRISIS

However there is a great deal we can do within our congregation to help ease the burden for our fellow congregants and, if our resources allow, the greater Portland Jewish community.

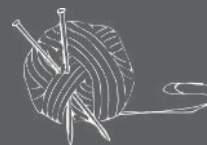

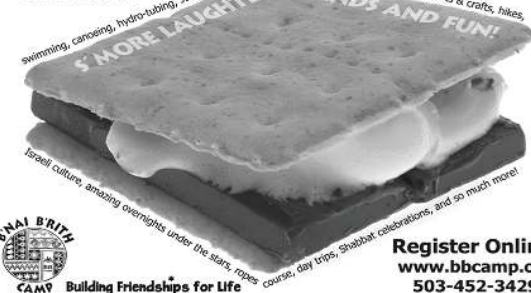

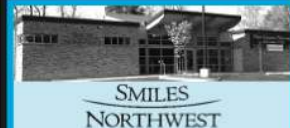

In order to make our High Holy Day services meaningful and pleasant for everyone, please remember these guidelines:

- * Parking: Cooperate with parking attendants and restricted zones. Those with blue DMV disabled parking tags MUST reserve parking (free of charge), to guarantee a space. Others may purchase a reserved spot in our lot for \$100. To arrange for disabled or reserved parking please contact Karen at 503.246.8831x100 or kwilkins@nevehshalom.org
- * Silence your cell phone/pager. In the event of an emergency during High Holy Day services call 503.475.2934
- * Service Decorum: Kindly do not enter or exit the services while the ark is open or during the Rabbi's sermon. Our ushers will close the doors during these solemn times. Please do your part to minimize disturbance to services by exiting at appropriate times.
- * Tickets will be checked, please have them with you each time you enter the facility.
- * Casual conversation during services and in the entry is distracting to fellow worshipers. Please keep talking to a minimum, and please whisper. Appropriate places to visit with friends include the outdoor plaza, courtyard, the parking lot, near the elevator, in the Foundation School hallway, and in the chapel or classrooms when children's services are not in session.
- * Behavior guidelines should be discussed with your children before arriving at synagogue: Use "indoor" voices, no running, no rough-housing, stay with parents or in areas designated for children (childcare, game rooms, youth services). Ushers will escort unsupervised children back to their parents.
