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Food banks report sharp increases in the numbers of people requesting food. Increased unemployment means larger numbers of people without healthcare coverage. Even those employed naturally feel increasingly insecure. Everyone is cutting back, a cycle which can only presage more layoffs and a deeper crisis.

Certainly the personal stress on families creates rippling repercussions within the organized Jewish community as well. Every synagogue and Jewish organization is coming to terms with the need to cut back, eliminate staff, mandate pay reductions, cancel programs, tighten belts. However necessary, the effect of such measures will inevitably add to the overall downward spiral.

But we can wring our hands only so long. Who will begin the process of addressing the very real needs of individuals within our community?

Spearheading a coordinated and collaborative effort for the Portland Jewish community is the Tikkun Olam Committee of Neveh Shalom under the able leadership of **Steve Sirkin**, with administrative support from **JoAnn Bezodis**. They have taken it upon themselves to awaken our local Jewish community to the fact that the economic crisis is not just out there. For many it is right in here, within our community with people struggling to put a roof over their heads, to feed, clothe and care for their families. Though several organizations were initiating their own efforts, our Tikkun Olam committee invited representatives from synagogues, Jewish agencies and organizations to work in concert to create a coordinating committee to share information and determine what we can all do together. Jewish Family and Child Service is at the table with the Community Relations Council, the Community Warehouse and the Jewish Review.

Together they are creating community events whose purpose is to inform us all of the extent of the need, ease the impact upon those currently experiencing difficulties and to direct the rest of us as to how we might be engaged to provide the necessary assistance. They have identified jobs as priority number one and the key to relieving much stress. However they see other possibilities from exploring the creation of a Hebrew Free Loan in Portland to impacting local and state-wide relief legislation.

I am enormously proud of the leadership role Steve and our Tikkun Olam committee has taken. We want to support their efforts and in weeks to come we will learn how each of us has a role to play.

P.S. I also want to commend highly the work of Neveh Shalom member **Susan Goldstein**, who has volunteered her time and her expertise each Wednesday morning after Minyan in the Zidell Chapel from 7:45-9am to meet with anyone engaged in career transition. She is a wealth of information and very knowledgeable about all aspects of job search. How thankful we should be for all these efforts.







Notes from Shomrei Teva

Sunday evening, February 8th, begins Tu B'shvat, our New Year of the Trees. This holiday, often considered a Jewish Earth Day, has become a time to celebrate with its own special seder (including one at Neveh Shalom), to plant trees (especially in Israel), and to

consider the current state of the earth. How can we perform tikkun olam? There are so many problems: air, water, loss of species, climate change. What can we do?

We are fortunate in that Neveh Shalom lies along a large section of wooded area with a creek (tributary of Fanno Creek) to the south. This land has become overgrown with non-native species like Himalayan blackberry, English ivy, clematis, and laurel. These invasives have choked out the natives reducing the overall health of the land and the creek. Now we have a project to clear out the invasives and replant the area with trees, shrubs, and ground cover appropriate to our region.

For months we cleared our first large section. On February 1st, we are doing our first planting. Now we can see tikkun olam every time we come to our synagogue. Just as we recently constructed and remodeled much of our building, we're also repairing our natural areas. Every third Sunday of the month we come out from 9-12 to do maintenance: to remove regrowth of invasives and debris, and to tend our new plants. Come out and dig around in the dirt and help restore nature and protect creation. It's a mitzvah.



Hebrew words are formed from roots by changing vowels and by adding a variety of prefixes and suffixes to that root. Prefixes can be prepositions (in, on, of, to) articles (the), etc. Suffixes can be pronouns (he, you, our) possessives or can indicate gender and number. Because of the way these prefixes and suffixes are added to the root, a single word in Hebrew might be translated into English as several words.

Does this seem too confusing? A simple and more enjoyable way to unwind this tangle of grammatical information is to enroll in our adult Hebrew classes. The ability to read and understand Hebrew opens many avenues to liturgical, biblical and modern language comprehension and appreciation.

The children enrolled in our Hebrew School are acquiring skills to unravel the mysteries of our ancient language, becoming proficient in reading and understanding that which is read. As parents, you can show your child that learning is a life-long pursuit and have a vehicle for sharing common goals by studying along with them. Are your children grown and out of the house? 
