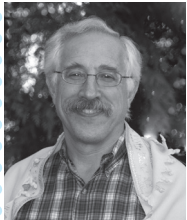

Crimes and Misdemeanors: Fugitive From Justice or Shame Be Damned: Polanski and Letterman

Woody Allen's 1989 award winning movie "Crimes and Misdemeanors" has to be one of my all time favorite films. Many will recall that the plot involves a Jewish ophthalmologist who successfully has his mistress murdered in order to protect his marriage. Though he suffers pangs of guilt for engaging in such a heinous crime, he not only gets away with it, but overcomes his sense of culpability as well. This, along with an additional subplot, raises important questions about right and wrong, good and evil, justice or the lack thereof.

These are also central themes of the entire High Holy Day period which we have just completed.

Similar questions are raised by the propinquity of the recent arrest of film director Roman Polanski in Switzerland and the attempted blackmail of talk show host David Letterman. Though their cases are clearly dissimilar, they both prompt fundamental questions of morality and ethics.

Roman Polanski confessed to raping a 13 year old child over 30 years ago. Prior to sentencing he fled to France, which has no extradition treaty with the United States and he has remained a fugitive from the law ever since. Today many artists and others have come to Polanski's defense, claiming that after all this time the perpetrator has by now become the victim. The claims in his defense are several: we permitted (or at least overlooked) many more liberties in the 1970s than we do today. Polanski has carried this burden and has suffered enough. His now adult victim wants this episode put behind her and does not want him prosecuted. He has led a tragic life as a survivor of the Holocaust, was abused himself as a child, and suffered the death of his wife of Sharon Tate who was brutally murdered by followers of Charles Manson.

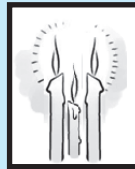

While most if not all of that is true, just as there is no statute of limitations on clergy or teachers who sexually abuse children, escape to a foreign country ought not excuse or exonerate such reprehensible behavior. Roman Polanski should be returned to the United States and receive whatever punishment is deemed appropriate.

David Letterman, rather than submit to blackmail, confessed on his TV program to having had sexual relations with an undisclosed number of members of his staff. In and of itself, he broke no law, unless he is criminally charged with some form of sexual harassment. It is behavior however that is on its own reprehensible. (And it is important to point out that I have joined these two situations only because they involve famous people and have come to our attention at the same time, not because there is any comparison between Polanski's crime and Letterman's dalliances.)

While certainly true that no one should submit to blackmail, what is of note about Letterman's confession is the apparent lack of self-reproach or disgrace. He offered no apology or expression of regret, except to his wife who he admitted was mortified by his behavior. Eric Denzenhall, a consultant on crisis management observed, "With the death of shame and geometric shortening of attention spans, yesterday's crisis is today's blip". If true, which I unfortunately suspect the assertion is, it is a terrible indictment of the times and society in which we live. Reprehensible behavior, by a president, elected official, TV personality or star athlete can readily be embraced or at least excused, because the society in which we live no longer sees such behavior as shameful and given a few weeks, who will remember anyway?

We must not accept the demeaning of our national character. Every individual must accept that s/he is accountable for his/her behavior. It is vital that we maintain a high standard of morality and ethics in all aspects of our private as well as public lives.

What a shame if by the time you read this, it is considered old news!

I experienced the High Holidays as a passage this year in a way that I haven't in the past. My husband's father passed away last March, so it was our first Jewish New Year without him. Perhaps this contributed to the intensity I felt in services, particularly at Kol Nidre. Rich has poignant memories of attending Kol Nidre services with his father every year throughout his childhood. I wonder if my grief around the loss of my father-in-law opened my heart to the rhythms and melodies and words of the prayers more than usual. **Rabbi Isaak's** sermon about the challenge and importance of a true apology moved me, and his jokes at the end of the service made me laugh so hard that the service in its entirety was quite cathartic. I'm grateful for the ways that my experiences in services at Neveh Shalom at Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur touched me spiritually and intellectually and emotionally. For several days afterward, I found the music of the prayers pleasantly wafting through my mind. **Rabbi Greenstein's** sermons also inspired my heart and imagination, with images of ladders and of torah study as a poetic striving for each one of us to find our path to truth and honor, beauty and love. Finally, **Jonathan Emanuel's** very engaging family services (complete with one of the best discussions of the story of Abraham and Isaac that I've ever heard) enabled me to share High Holiday services with our 10-year-old son in a way that was interesting and fun for both of us. I hope that each one of you will reach for the gifts that our synagogue has to offer, and that you will be as richly rewarded for your efforts as I have been.

Notes from Shomrei Teva

Magen Tzedek and Eco-Kosher



Around the High Holidays, **Rabbi Isaak** wrote to Neveh Shalom members about a new hekhsher from the Conservative movement. Magen Tzedek is designed to ensure that foods with its certification are koshered according to the letter of the law, and are “ethically kosher”, in that animal welfare, the rights and treatment of workers, and good environmental practices are also taken into account. Magen Tzedek

is one more example of a newer Jewish concept: eco-kosher.

In the 1970's, Rabbi Zalman Schachter-Shalomi coined the term eco-kosher to connect modern ecology with kashrut, our ancient dietary laws. Eco-kosher is not intended to displace traditional practices of kashrut, but to add new dimensions to it. Given recent disclosures at Agriprocessors, once the nation's largest kosher facility, it is clear that for most modern Jews, ethics have to be taken into account.

By joining the most expansive sense of healing the earth to the most precise code of daily conduct, eco-kosher signals the importance of both broadening kashrut and turning ecological consciousness into everyday action, an end to which Shomrei Teva has been working at Neveh Shalom.

From Morah Rachel (Pre-K/K teacher in Kochavim):

What an exciting start to our year together! Our Kochavim K'tanim are already showing how fast they are picking up the Hebrew language. We have started learning the Hebrew Alef-Bet (alphabet), each week focusing on a new letter. Already, your Kochavim are sharpening their letter writing and recognition skills. Each day we are putting our new words up on the wall so we can see how many words we know, and the walls are filling up fast.

From Morah Bat-Ami (1st/2nd grade teacher in Kochavim):

We have a lovely mix of students in our class this year, with some returning students and others new to our program. Each day we practice our speaking by introducing ourselves to our classroom barvazony (rubber-ducky) and playing games, such as one in which the kids each talk about their favorite foods. 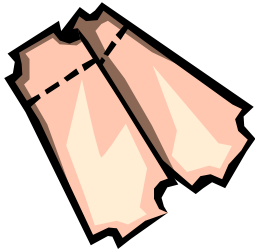
