The tradition however is not to blow the shofar on Shabbat, so this year on the first day of Rosh Hashanah we missed the clarion call. Instead, we were honored to hear the excitement and energy about Neveh Shalom's new youth program for teenagers from four of our many new youth leaders. For a teenager, being involved and connected to the synagogue and other Jewish friends can mean the world, even if one is already part of BBYO or another youth group. Since I received so many requests asking for a transcript of their speeches, I thought I would let them tell you again in their own words:

Hello and welcome ladies and gentlemen, my name is Alex Milbert and I am here on behalf of NSY. NSY stands for Neveh Shalom Youth. Our youth group is from 8th to 12th grade and takes place in Neveh and other parts around the community. I am here for us, I am here for all. Why you might ask? Well it takes a story. A few months ago at a square table inside Round Table Pizza Rabbi Brad and Mr. Jonathan Emanuel talked to me and a group of kids about starting a youth group. Now this sounded a little lame to be honest because starting a whole new group is really hard so I thought that there wouldn't be a lot of fun to it. **Continued on page 3.** 

# If Not Now, When? Today & Tomorrow אם לא עכשו, אימתי? היום ומחר

The third in the "Jewish Giving" study series...Print or copy this "instant lesson" and start a discussion around your Shabbat dinner table – appropriate for ALL ages!

The great scholar Maimonides wrote about the Laws of Gifts to the Poor (10.7-15) in his book the Mishnah Torah. He took Jewish ideas about charity from the Bible, the Talmud and from other rabbinical books of wisdom to create an eight step code called the **Ladder of Tzedakah**. It tells of *the eight degrees of tzedakah* in order of increasing importance. During the coming months, we will briefly examine these steps.

This month we focus on Maimonides seventh rung of giving. Read the following story and see if you can put yourself into the shoes of our characters. What choice would you make?

## John and Jane's crisis:

John and Jane are a successful couple who have always given at least 10% of their comfortable income to charitable organizations. Every month they donate to: The American Cancer Society, The Sierra Club, Save the Children, and the Jewish Federation. Jane's father died at a young age of lung cancer; both John and Jane are outdoor enthusiasts and ardent environmentalists; John sits on the board of directors of the Federation; both care deeply about the fate of children in impoverished countries and here in the US. In other words they believe strongly in the mission statement of each of these organizations they help support!

Unfortunately, John and Jane's finances have been hit by the current economic crisis. John was laid off from his job as a marketing director for a large company. His prospects are slim. They are currently living on Jane's salary as a social worker, but she recently found out her position is in jeopardy. With bills to pay and less income to pay them with, they have begun to resent the hole their charitable donations make in their monthly budget. They would like to continue to give, but only to the one organization that they can donate to happily.

### What should John and Jane do?

Although John and Jane are making the decision to give less than they have in the past, we can admire their commitment to giving, even when times are tough. According to Maimonides the seventh rung of giving is: giving happily, but inadequately. Sometimes we can't give as much as we'd like to, but when we are able to give a little, and give it happily, we are climbing the ladder towards higher forms of giving. If you were John or Jane what would you do?

## Drash

"This past year, I had the strange experience of convincing my child that he loves me." These were the first words of the drash that Mel Berwin, a congregant and mother of three children, including seven-yearold Lev, who has Asperger's Syndrome, gave at a Shabbat morning service last month. Children with Asperger's Syndrome love just as deeply as other people, but their brains lack the "instruction manual" of how to express this love. Reading parashat Nitzavim. Mel realized that the Jewish people is often in a similar situation before God, who has given us Torah as an "instruction manual" of how to express this love, even when we may feel confused about how to do so. ## Neveh Shalom's "Back to Shul BBQ" on Sunday, September

13th, not only brought together over 350 new and old members, friends, and family, but also represented a significant step in Neveh Shalom's move toward sustainability. Shomrei Teva, the congregation's environmental team, managed an event waste reduction program by providing special composting bins beside the regular garbage cans. All food waste and paper plates and napkins were collected for composting while plastic or coated items went into the garbage. Attendees appeared interested and pleased that they could do more than just throw things into the garbage. All told, Shomrei Teva estimates that over 100 pounds of material will be turned into healthy, reusable compost rather than sent to a landfill. This event was greatly aided by teens from Neveh Shalom's youth program, Heilberg Garbage and Recycling, who donated the bins for this event, Metro, who will take the material to a composting facility, and the City of Portland's Bureau of Planning and Sustainability, who provided guidance and signage. Of course it all happened because of the great volunteers from Shomrei Teva, who take the Jewish teaching of Bal Tashchit, "do not waste", to heart. **- Jordan (Yaakov) Epstein**

## Notes from Shomrei Teva

On the eve of 15th Tishrei (October 2nd), Sukkot begins. One of the holiday's names is HaChag, The Festival, because it was so important and central to the world of the ancient Israelites.

Sukkot is profoundly connected to the natural world: we build a sukkah out of natural materials, eat the produce and harvest of the land while inside, and even sleep in it amidst the sounds and smells of nature. How can we preserve and strengthen the deep connection between Sukkot and our precious environment?

First, build or help build a sukkah. Decorate it with homemade items and save them from year to year as part of your family's "Sukkot collection". Purchase as much locally grown and organic food as you can. Pledge to reduce or eliminate the use of pesticides and herbicides in your yard, where the sukkah is located. Reduce your use of water by putting low-flow aerators on your faucets at home. (On the last day of Sukkot, a prayer for rain is added to the Amidah.) Sleep in a sukkah and watch the stars overhead. Finally, pray in the sukkah.

Wave the lulav and etrog, recite the traditional prayers, and from Kabbalah consider this meditation: *From the east we ask for strength and balance, the west, sound thinking and self-clarity. To the south, we seek healing of body and emotional wounds, the north, illumination and personal vision. Looking up we acknowledge God's transcendence, looking down, God's immanence.* Chag Sameach.
