Zokhreinu l'Chaym: Remember Us for Life

"Remember us for life, O Sovereign who delights in life. Inscribe us in the Book of Life, for Your sake, O God of life." We chant this refrain and others akin to it multiple times at every service throughout the Ten Days of Repentance. From the opening Amidah on the eve of Rosh Hashanah through the closing of the gates as the sun sets during Neilah, we beseech God to grant us

But is it just a pulse and breath that we crave or something greater? We come to the synagogue acknowledging our frailties. We are mindful on these days especially of our

mortality, but we know not the length of our days. All we know is that we have thankfully made it through another year, but such accomplishment brings us inevitably closer to the end of this life. Our mortality is a constant reminder that we have but limited days to undertake new challenges, to accomplish desired goals, to experience that which one human being might reasonably expect to taste in one lifetime. There is little time to waste on the frivolous.

Age is also invariably accompanied by a weakening of the body, a loss of youthful vigor, new aches and pains we do not welcome, but cannot outwit. Our marriages and friendships become ever more sacred as sources of love, companionship and affection. We may face thoughts of retirement with a combination of longing and terror. We marvel as our children grow, mature and become independent, seek their own life's partners and ways to contribute to society, eventually creating families of their own.

Happy New Year! With a new year upon us, it is appropriate for me to discuss what the major goals are for the Board of Directors this year. Last month I reviewed the year just completed, let me discuss what we plan on accomplishing this year.

Our primary financial concern this year is to remain focused on running an efficient organization while continuing to provide superior services to our membership and keeping dues in line. Although last year's budget resulted in a small deficit, given the environment we found ourselves in, we were satisfied that we responded well to an extreme and unpredictable economy. We have decided to carry that deficit forward and deal with the financial issues posed in this fiscal year, and have planned for a balanced budget. It won't be easy and some services will be negatively impacted. Much will depend upon the success of our new Annual Giving program and the condition of the economic environment overall. If Not Now, When? Today & Tomorrow אם לא עכשו, אימתי? היום ומחר

The second in the "Jewish Giving" study series...Print or copy this "instant lesson" and start a discussion around your Shabbat dinner table - appropriate for ALL ages!

The great scholar Maimonides wrote about the Laws of Gifts to the Poor (10.7-15) in his book the Mishnah Torah. He took Jewish ideas about charity from the Bible, the Talmud and from other rabbinical books of wisdom to create an eight step code called Ladder of Tzedakah. It tells us about the eight degrees of tzedakah in order of increasing importance. During the coming months, we will briefly examine these steps.

Read and discuss this text below...

Who fulfilled a mitzvah?

A homeless woman named Ruth walks into a deserted doctor's office at 6:00 pm on a cold winter's evening. Doctor Smith comes out to find the woman weeping in the waiting area. "Whatever is the matter?" he asks.

"It's my arm," Ruth replies, "I think its broken." Dr. Smith takes in her ragged appearance, her stench, and notices that while her arm is scraped and bloody, it is most definitely not broken. Dr. Smith widens his eyes in sympathy, smiles, reaches into his pocket for a dollar, and directs her toward the bus that will take her to the free clinic.

Meanwhile Dr. Jones enters the waiting room. She has her coat on and her briefcase in hand. When she catches sight of the homeless woman she shakes her head in disgust and mutters something about "darn freeloaders." Nevertheless she sits down to clean and dress Ruth's wound. She doesn't look up, not even to accept Ruth's feeble "thanks," and does not watch her walk out into the cold niaht.

So, who was it?

While Dr. Smith appeared sympathetic, he ultimately gave nothing. Dr. Jones gave grudgingly, but she still gave. According to Maimonides the lowest level of giving tzedakah (which means justice, not charity) is when the giver gives unwillingly. Giving unwillingly, like Dr. Jones, is preferable to not giving at all, like Dr. Smith, and still fulfills the commandment of tzedakah.

- Parking: Cooperate with parking attendants and restricted zones. A
 limited number of parking spots in the Neveh Shalom lot are available by
 RESERVATION ONLY: Disabled (free with DMV permit) and Reserved
 (\$100 per space). Reservation deadline: September 16. Contact Marg
 Everett to reserve, meverett@nevehshalom.org or 503-246-8831x112.
- **Silence your cell phone/pager.** For emergencies during services, please call 503.475.2934.
- Tickets will be checked, please have them with you.
- Service Decorum: Kindly do not enter or exit the services while
 the ark is open or during the Rabbi's sermon. Our ushers will assist in
 upholding this decorum by closing doors during these solemn times.
 Please do your part to minimize disturbance to services by exiting at
 appropriate times.
- Casual conversation during services and in the entry is distracting
 to fellow worshipers. Please keep talking to a minimum, and that in
 a whisper. Appropriate places to visit with friends include the plaza,
 courtyard, parking lot, near the elevator, in the Foundation School hallway,
 and in the chapel or classrooms when children's services are not in
 session.
- Behavior guidelines should be discussed with your children before
 arriving at synagogue: Use "indoor" voices, no running, no rough-housing,
 stay with parents or in areas designated for children (childcare, game
 rooms, youth services). Ushers will escort unsupervised children back to
 their parents.

5770: Looking Back, Looking Forward

During the High Holidays we look inward, and we can also look outward, toward the earth. How have we

treated it? Have we changed our life-styles and habits to reduce our "environmental footprint"? What have we done to teach our children to care for the earth? What will we do next year as environmental concerns grow? These, like questions we ask about our relationships with people and God, are also valid for consideration during this personal and most holy of times.

Shomrei Teva planted over 350 native plants last year in our creek restoration project. For next year we'll continue to maintain the site and expand it, adding plants as they become available. We'll again plan for a synagogue Tu B'Shvat seder, in late January. The Portland Tuv Ha'Aretz project, which Shomrei Teva helped create, continues to grow and thrive. Now we're considering new projects.

Creating a community garden on site, making synagogue events more sustainable (especially those involving food), conducting an environmental audit at the shul, setting up car pools, and providing members with more information to make their simchas "greener" are some of the ideas we're considering. 


