

In Everlasting Memory

Tradition

One of the noblest Jewish traditions is the preservation of the name of a loved one on the Memorial Board in the Synagogue Sanctuary. Just as we light a memorial candle each year on the anniversary of death, this is an eternal reminder of our dear departed ones and the love and respect their memory evokes.

The Passage of Time

Jewish tradition teaches us to mark the passing of time as we grieve the loss of a loved one. We move from shiva (7-days), to sheloshim (30-days), and through the first year of reciting kaddish daily. After that, kaddish is only said once per year on the yahrzeit (anniversary). Yet, we know that the memory of our loved one lives on in our hearts for eternity.

Dedicating a memorial plaque with the name of your loved one serves as a blessing in many ways:

Endurance

The bronze plaque is a durable reminder of your family name, permanently displayed as long as our synagogue shall stand.



The larger plaque is displayed for one full year upon delivery and each year afterward during the Hebrew Yahrzeit month.

Ha Makom - The Place

The bronze plaque creates a physical space of kedusha, holiness, set apart for your family name.

An Unbroken Chain

The bronze plaque is a connection to our past, linking generation to generation. We who attend Neveh Shalom today are reminded of our benefactors who went before us, and of our duty to provide for those yet to come.

Sanctuary Memorial Boards


At Neveh Shalom, we have two beautiful Memorial Boards, which serve two functions. A large plaque is placed in the Sanctuary for the first full year and for one month each year after that; the Hebrew month of Yahrzeit. Another smaller plaque is permanently maintained in the Memorial Niche. The cost for this set of plaques is \$800.

Dedication

Each year at Shavuot (the Feast of Weeks, 50 days after Passover), Neveh Shalom dedicates the memorial plaques that have arrived over the past calendar year.

At this dedication, each name is read aloud, and mourners are invited to stand for a special prayer of kaddish during the Yizkor service.

In 2012, we have the rare event when Yizkor Shavuot coincides with the U.S. observance of Memorial Day. This makes it a particularly good year to order the memorial plaque you've been considering.
