



Congregation Neveh Shalom Covid Vaccination and Mask Policies While On Campus

Health

- You should only come to the CNS building **if you are feeling healthy**.
 - Do not come to CNS if you're feeling ill.
 - Do not come to CNS if you have COVID – including being asymptomatic.

Vaccination

1. All congregants, guests, and visitors who are **eligible to be vaccinated and will be in the building for more than 15 minutes are expected to be vaccinated** – this expectation will be the “honor system” – proof of vaccination will not be required.
2. Children under the age of 12 and those not eligible for vaccination **are welcome** to attend services/programs in the building.
3. The above “honor system” notwithstanding, we are requesting that congregants and guests **provide advance documentation of vaccination status**. This request will help with the various logistics involved in CNS programs, services, meetings, etc. You may provide vaccination documentation by [clicking here](#).

Masking While at CNS

1. All congregants, guests, and staff will be **required to wear appropriate and correctly fitted (covering nose and mouth) facemasks** in all public indoor spaces at CNS. This masking requirement applies to all worship services, education (over age 2), programs, meetings, etc. in the CNS building.

Exceptions to the above masking policy are:

- Leaders of / honorees at worship services (clergy, lay leaders, b'nai mitzvah, etc.) may be maskless during the time that they are leading the service – but will appropriately distance themselves from worshippers.
 - Fully vaccinated synagogue staff, in private offices and/or meeting with other staff when all participants agree.
 - Fully vaccinated synagogue clergy/staff meeting with other fully vaccinated individuals may conduct such meetings without masks when all participants agree.
2. Masking continues to be encouraged, though not required outdoors while on the CNS campus.

CNS expects members, guests, and staff to adhere to this masking policy while on campus to protect the vulnerable and unvaccinated among us, including children. Those not adhering to the policy will be asked to put on an appropriate mask; if that individual refuses, they are subject to removal from the CNS premises.
