Our Values

Foundation School is based on the ideals and traditions of the Jewish faith and is dedicated to providing exceptional early childhood education. While our curriculum is centered on the foundations of Jewish learning, our program is open to all.

We value play as every child's natural way of learning and view each child as a competent and unique learner. Our qualified and experienced staff encourages the growth of the whole child; intellectual, social, emotional, physical and spiritual. We encourage the development of each child's creativity, curiosity and character through respectful and age-appropriate practices alongside an emergent curriculum.

For over 60 years, we have embraced our youngest learners – sparking imaginations, instilling a sense of wonder, and providing the building blocks for the next generation of creative and confident problem-solvers. The children who are part of the Foundation School legacy embrace an "anything is possible" approach to life where they are asked to wonder, encouraged to inquire, and participate in the process of bringing young families together for a lifetime of friendship.

Educational Approach

Foundation School is inspired by the Reggio Emilia educational philosophy. We see our students as infinitely capable, and as such, our teachers collaborate with students to create meaningful and relevant curriculum that inspires the particular group of learners in each classroom community. We believe it is our task to teach our students to be able citizens of our community who have the skills to be independent learners, kind friends, and advocates for themselves as they gain readiness for kindergarten and the world beyond.

Our teachers take time to document each child's process of learning. As we take photos of the children engaged in activity, write down their words, and display them for the community to see, they begin to understand that their learning has power. Teachers structure the environment to help children expand their academic and social potential, encouraging discovery and meaningful learning in developmentally appropriate ways.

ALIYAH K-6

The warm community of ALIYAH Jewish learning provides engaging, high-level learning opportunities for every student. Our students experience Jewish holidays and traditions, gain strong Hebrew language skills, and grow from the many opportunities for meaningful leadership within the congregational community. Our teachers are dynamic and nurturing, and our kids enjoy their experience of Jewish education. Our highest goal is for our children to feel at home in Judaism, by gaining literacy about our traditions, and experiences that ignite curiosity and connection.

Our Innovative Program

We are proud to have the most thorough and innovative supplementary Jewish education program in Portland. Students have many opportunities to "live" their Judaism, whether leading services, celebrating holidays, putting on a Jewish wedding celebration, cooking Jewish foods, and participating in *tzedakah* projects that support others in our community.

On Sunday mornings, all K-6 children attend an experiential, social, content-rich Judaics program. Each grade has its own curricular topic of exploration, a specific mitzvah or Jewish value to practice, and various *chugim* (electives) such as music, art, cooking, book-lovers, and super-hero comic-writing. Parents and grandparents are invited to family programs to share in their child's learning and connect with our community.

Our students learn Hebrew at their own pace with an individual Hebrew teacher, 30 minutes per week, in



person or on zoom. They participate in setting goals for their own learning, and parents are invited to conferences twice per year to celebrate their child's progress.

Israeli Pathways (אפיק ישראלי)

Israeli families are invited to join ALIYAH through a new, special program called Israeli Pathways (אפיק ישראלי) in which Hebrew-speaking children have a culturally specific, social elective taught in Hebrew. Contact us for more information!

Inclusion

ALIYAH is an inclusive community that welcomes students across the spectrum of learning styles and needs. We work closely with families to create individualized learning plans as necessary and celebrate the achievements of each of our students based on their own abilities. We learn throughout our program that every individual has strengths and challenges and the beauty of a community is that we all gain from supporting each other.

Excellent Teachers & Leaders

Our excellent ALIYAH teachers are dedicated to Jewish life and learning. They care about the success of each student and focus on creating a learning environment that supports every child in his/her learning as well as in building a strong community of friends. Mel Berwin has led our education programs since 2011, bringing wisdom, warmth, and creativity to her role in our congregation and championing inclusion, educational innovation, and professional development for Jewish educators throughout the Portland area.

YOUTH EDUCATION

B'nai Mitzvah

The bar/bat/brit mitzvah year is an amazing milestone for our youth and their families. We offer support throughout the planning stages for families approaching this celebration. Our ALIYAH program prepares students for leading prayers with confidence and comprehension. Parent learning opportunities and meetings in 5th and 6th grades offer families connection with each other and logistical support. Our year-long b'nai mitzvah tutoring program (separate from the ALIYAH Hebrew tutoring) provides each child the chance to work one-on-one with a qualified tutor to achieve personal goals according to his/her own learning style. And our clergy works with students and families throughout the year to create a ceremony that is personally and communally meaningful.



Tichon (High School)

7th-12th graders at Neveh Shalom stay engaged in Jewish learning and social life through our ALIYAH Tichon program on Wednesday evenings, 6:30-8:30pm. Our classes range from high-level conversation about important topics of their choice (Being Jewish in a Multi-cultural World, Judaism and the Environment, Comparative Judaism, Interfaith Connections), to fun and active electives such as Jewish cooking, art, improv, and ethical debate.

7th graders make new friends, young and old, in a much-loved intergenerational program called Mensches & Mavens, and 12th graders engage in a senior seminar with Rabbi Kosak to prepare them for launching into Jewish adulthood.



An optional family-friendly kosher buffet dinner on Wednesday evenings allows teens an important time to see friends and socialize over burritos or stir-fry.

Teen Madrichim

Teens in 8th-12th grades are invited to apply for positions as Madrichim, a paid internship program assisting teachers and students on Sunday mornings. Madrichim gain great leadership skills while participating in practical leadership development training throughout the year and are valued members of our teaching team!

Hebrew for Teens

We encourage continued Hebrew learning for our teens! With enough interest, we offer a Hebrew class on Weds evening during Tichon or at another mutually convenient time during the week.

Level One: Ready to Read & Speak

For those with a working knowledge of the Alef-Bet and some basic Hebrew vocabulary. Focus on practical vocabulary and grammar. *Prerequisite: Beginning Hebrew, or its equivalent level of mastery.*

Level Two: Advanced Hebrew Teacher: Meital Wecksler

Pick up where you left off in Level One. Use engaging reading material to improve reading, speaking, and

comprehension skills. Broaden vocabulary and grammar to include focus on past, present, and future tense and additional verb forms. *Prerequisite: Ready to Read & Speak, or its equivalent level of mastery.*

Level Three: Conversational

Continue practicing Hebrew with a focus on real life situations and stories. Discuss Israeli news articles and other modern media as well as experiences from your week. *Prerequisite: Advanced Hebrew, or its equivalent level of mastery.*

Rabbi David Kosak



History, Theology and Poetry of the Prayerbook Sundays, Nov-Mar, 12:15-1:15pm w/ Rabbi David Kosak In this accessible, intermediate level course, we will examine the history and literary meaning of our central prayers. This will allow us to understand the background in which these prayers arose as well as how their structure and imagery convey their central message. Understanding these two components will help us grasp the purpose and ideas of the prayers as well as deepening our knowledge of how a given prayer makes its point. Finally, we will allow time in class to discuss how we can relate to these messages as contemporary Jews. No Hebrew required.

Sunday, 2:00-4:00pm | Three dates to choose from: Nov 13, Feb 12, or Apr 16, With Rabbi David Kosak In my years working in the rabbinate, I have observed how some, but not all, families instinctually prepare in advance for an inevitable loss by engaging in open conversations about values, love, and even regrets. These profound talks positively enrich a family. This year, I will be offering three stand-alone opportunities for you and your loved ones to gather and do this work in a facilitated setting. It is my hope that doing this work consciously, before death is at hand, will deepen your bonds, reduce your fear to have honest conversations, and make the eventual loss easier to navigate.

Bris/Baby Naming

Jewish tradition has beautiful ways to commemorate life cycle events, starting from the very beginning of life. Our clergy and staff are here to help with the details to create a beautiful ceremony for you and your (newly expanded) family.

Brit Milah/Bris: A brit milah, often called a bris, is the traditional 8th-day circumcision for boys. The bris can be held at a home or in the synagogue. The professional who performs the circumcision is called a *mohel*, and Oregon Jewish Life has a list of some of the *mohels* in Portland.

Simchat Bat/Baby Naming: Usually called a simchat bat ("rejoicing in the daughter"), a baby naming for a girl can take on the form and timing that's best for the family. Talk with our clergy and staff to determine the details.

Bar/Bat/Brit Mitzvah

The bar/bat/brit mitzvah year is an amazing milestone for our youth and their families. We offer planning support and prepare students to lead prayers with confidence and comprehension.

Our year-long b'nai mitzvah tutoring program provides each child with the chance to work one-on-one with a professional tutor. Our clergy work with students and families throughout the year to create a ceremony that is personally and communally meaningful.




