### From the Pulpit



### The Pace of Freedom

For most of us, the smells and sounds of our Pesach Seder evoke treasured memories. Though for me, as a young child, this was not always the case. Frightened to sing in front of a crowd, reluctant to snap on a tie, my parents had to bribe me to say the four questions... and gefilte fish and horseradish was not exactly my favorite of combinations.

Nevertheless, Pesach has become one of my favorite holidays. I have joined the ranks of Jews throughout the world who have made the Seder the most celebrated ritual in modern Jewish life. I have grown to love the Hillel sandwich. And yet, with my newfound adoration I have noticed something troublesome. Inevitably at every Seder, there is always at least one relative who nudges, "How long till we eat? Let's make this a quick one!"

What is the rush? We have likened ourselves to our ancient Israelite ancestors. So eager to move towards freedom, to leave the whip of slavery, they ate hurriedly while walking and rushed out of Egypt with no time even to bake bread properly. Yet freedom that is rushed is not really true freedom. Independence, liberty, and emancipation by

their very definition do not bow down to any outside restraints. Our ancestors were freed from slavery yet they were not truly free. The dean of my rabbinical school, Rabbi Brad Artson, has taught that the people of Israel's exodus from Egypt was incomplete. The Israelite people were not granted the right to move to a new land and make an important life transition according to their own pace. Furthermore, the mechanism of slavery still remained intact within Egypt and one cannot truly be considered free while others are left to suffer. As the Jewish people crossed the red sea and walked upon dry land they took only steps towards the promise of true freedom.

Ironically, it is this unfinished freedom, restrained by the rushing threat of an approaching enemy and the oppressive forces still at large that became the paradigmatic narrative of the civil rights movement and inspired countless liberations throughout history. Perhaps the Exodus from Egypt has become a model for so many because it paves the way towards true freedom and hints at a universal liberation. Our rabbis of old certainly viewed the Exodus as an introduction to a more complete and ideal freedom. The sages of the Midrash explain that our ancestors departure from Egypt was rushed, but in the messianic era "you will not depart in haste, nor will you leave in flight." The Jewish idea of a messianic era is synonymous with universal liberation. It is an ideal time when war will not be known and all people will think and move unchained, dancing freely to the rhythmic song between their souls and their God.

So this year let us celebrate that we are not rushed and create a Seder that engages our potential for true complete freedom. After all, what is the hurry, I can think of few things more important than teaching/discussing with your family, your friends, your children the story of their people's quest from slavery to self-determination. Teaching them that this quest is not yet complete and discussing how we can partner with God—Itakan olam bmalcut shadi—to reconstruct the world in the image of the divine. It is customary to recline on Passover and treat each other like kings and queens, so put a pillow on your chair, begin pouring the first of four glasses of wine for the one sitting next to you, relax... take your time, and re-tell your stories!



### USCJ Leaders Renew Solidarity with Israel, Masorti Movement by Maxine Fischbein, Communications Chair, Pacific Northwest Region, USCJ

They didn't have to think twice, says Alexandra Cyngiser, of the United Synagogue of Conservative Judaism's Regional Presidents' Council decision to hold their annual multi-day meeting in conjunction with a solidarity mission to Israel. According to Cyngiser—newly-elected president of the USCJ Pacific Northwest Region and one of the organizers of the Jerusalem trip—the mission, held January 10-21, 2007, saw representatives from 14 USCJ regions expressing solidarity with the people of Israel and the Masorti (Conservative) movement in Israel.

While she had previously heard much about the Shirley and Jacob Fuchsberg Center—which was home base for the mission—nothing could compare to "being there and experiencing its warmth and vibrancy." The center, which includes the Moreshet Yisrael Synagogue, a Yeshiva, residences for students and land for future development is, according to Cyngiser, "an endeavor we should all support."

Cyngiser urges Diaspora Conservative Jews to show solidarity with Israel and the Conservative movement by visiting the Jewish homeland and the Fuchsberg Center.

Cyngiser, who was installed as President of the Pacific Northwest Region on February 25th, hopes to provide similar opportunities for Conservative congregants to visit Israel on future missions. Stay tuned for details!

Since we are so spread out geographically (the Region encompasses Alberta, British Columbia, Washington and Oregon) it is hard for us to meet and share ideas on a regular basis. The idea of an annual Shabbaton was enthusiastically received, as well as the creation of an e-mail group discussion for board presidents.

If you have an opportunity to visit any of the other Conservative synagogues in the PNW Region, I encourage you to do so. See what other congregations in our Region are doing, and bring those ideas back home to Neveh Shalom.

will be a guest cantor with the orchestra that night.



### Religious School

As an educator, it would be difficult to pass up the opportunity to talk about the Four Children who are described in the Pesach hagaddah. Our classrooms are always filled with children who learn at different paces, through a variety of senses and modes and using many different intelligence levels. Our challenge as parents and educators is to be aware of the child before us and attempt to teach them at their ability.

The entire Seder is merely a stage set for the questions of the children. The questions in the hagaddah are meant to guide the parents in instructing their children on how to ask and then to provide them with the proper answers.

The wise child's question is his/her thirst for knowledge. Therefore, "you must expound to them the laws of the Passover, that we may not eat anything after the paschal sacrifice." This particular law (regarding the paschal sacrifice) is the very last one mentioned in the Mishnah about Passover, so the way to answer the wise child is to teach him/her everything, down to the last detail.

The wicked child asks, "What is this service to you?" implying that this has nothing to do with him/her. By speaking this way, they are excluding themselves from the Jewish community. In my opinion, the response to this child is problematic. It is a harsh statement that only alienates him/her further from the home experience and community participation. It does not open opportunities for dialogue nor does it try to understand where this child is coming from. The hagaddah states as the response to this child: "Blunt their teeth and say, 'It is because of that which the Lord did for me when I came forth from Egypt: for me not for him/her—for if he/she had been there, he/she would not have been

redeemed." It takes extreme patience to deal with a child like this, but it should be our goal to find the path that speaks to him/her and keep them engaged in our classroom.

The simple child asks, "What is this?" This question reveals a lack of understanding. They are amazed at everything. The parent must give a concise but clear answer, to match the child's intelligence and ability to comprehend.

And the child who does not know how to ask, you shall yourself begin for him/her. This is the child who has not even begun to learn yet. It is the parent's responsibility to take the initiative and to instruct them, to encourage them and to stimulate them to learn.

It is a mistake to assume that only children fall into the four categories stated above. As we get older, it becomes increasingly more difficult to face the fact that we are lacking in knowledge of Jewish customs and laws, ceremonies or language, and are embarrassed to ask the questions and seek the answers.

There are several ways that our adult community can gather to enrich their Jewish lives in study. **Rabbis Stampfer, Isaak,** and **Greenstein** and **Cantor Shivers** offer classes ranging from current topics and book discussions to prayer, bible, and Jewish mystical theology. Classes are also available in beginning Hebrew, and Introduction to Judaism. If you desire a class that is not offered in the Neveh Shalom Program Guide, please contact me and I will see if a class that interests you can be formed. My direct line is 503.293.7306.
