### FROM THE PULPIT

#### Who is the Messiah?

We just finished commemorating T'isha B'Av. our summer fast dav remembering the past destruction of our central temple and civilization. According to tradition, the Messiah will be born on T'isha B'Av. But who/what is the "Messiah?" The word sounds very Christian and for many may evoke

images of fanatic leaders or people living zealously on a compound. In fact, the coming of the messiah or a messianic age is a central pillar of Judaism. The prayers we utter in our siddur abound with hopes for the coming of the Messiah. Yigdal, the song we sing to conclude many services, was written by the great Maimonides and blatantly states that in order to have true faith one must believe in the coming of the messiah. Every time you or your children have ever swayed to the "ly ly la la la la ly ly" of Havdallah—be it at summer camp, synagogue, or your own home—the words you were singing called out for the coming of the Moshiach (Hebrew for "Messiah," meaning "Anointed One").

David Melech Israel, the famous King David whom we also sing a great deal about, was known as "The Anointed King." Our people envisioned that David's position of authority would continue until the end of his life and be inherited by an eternal chain of lineage carrying on his dynasty. King David's empire fell and his lineage was lost, but the rabbis of the Talmud still dreamed of a son of David. At the climax of human history he would redeem the people Israel from oppression and reign again as King, establishing God's will for humanity on earth.

For many thinkers throughout Judaism's intellectual history this Messiah was to be a literal person. Jewish history has known many messianic pretenders who claimed to be the messiah, yet all eventually lost their credibility. Bringing an end to war throughout the world and establishing peace on the ground and in our hearts is but one of the many requirements that must be fulfilled to assert that the messiah has come. This is one reason (among many) why it is impossible for groups such as Jews for Jesus, who claim that the messiah was already here, to be compatible with Judaism. Christianity believes

#### CAPITAL & ENDOWMENT CAMPAIGN



### Once in a Generation

For Generations to Come

The Neveh Shalom Capital & Endowment Campaign went public this past June 5th with a meeting and celebration in Birnbach Hall. It was announced that the 18-month quiet phase of the campaign had raised \$4.73

million, which is over 50 percent of the overall fundraising goal of \$9 million. The effort to raise capital for the addition of

a new intermediate chapel, administrative wing, and extensive upgrades to the existing building has several significant lead gifts to date. Renee & Irwin Holzman and family made a gift of \$1 million to the campaign and will name the new chapel in honor Rabbi Joshua & Goldie Stampfer. Max Birnbach's gift of \$850,000 includes the rededication of the gift shop in honor of Gloria Bacharach. More than 60 other congregants have committed gifts to the campaign as of press time.

Achieving half of a capital campaign's fundraising goal before going public is enormously gratifying, and campaign co-chairs Alan Blank and Merritt Yoelin would like to thank all members of the campaign committee, Executive Director Fred Rothstein and his staff, as well as each Neveh Shalom member who has made a gift to date. "It's very pleasing to bring the campaign to the entire membership knowing that we're half way there," said Blank. "But it's important to remember that we have a lot of work still to go before we hit our mark."

As the summer of 2007 progresses, congregational members will be hearing from fellow congregants and volunteer campaign solicitors to invite them to face-toface meetings and presentations on the details of the campaign. "All of our families can share in the success of the campaign by making a gift that represents the connection each member has to the congregation," said Yoelin. "If each member participates to the extent of their giving ability, we will more easily reach our common goal and move forward in creating a synagogue building and campus that will better serve our members now and over the next 40 years."

AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE VII Section 3 (page 11) Section 3. The Trustees shall meet at least once each quarter-calendar year between August 1and November 30. and, in their discretion, more often as theythe Trustees deem necessary, to review the condition of the Fund. A quorum to transact business shall consist of one-half the total number of Trustees serving at any given time. Trustees may not vote at meetings by proxy. Notice of any meetings shall be given at least ten (10) days before the meeting. by mail, electronic or telephonic means. Notice may be waived as provided in this Section. Attendance of a Trustee at a meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting except where a Trustee attends a meeting for the express purpose of objecting to the transaction of any business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened. Meetings of the Trustees may be held by conference, telephone or by other means of communicathn by which all participants can hear each other simultaneously during the meeting, and such participation shall constitute presence in person at the meeting. Whenever any notice required to be given to any Trustee, a waiver thereof in writing. signed by the person or persons entitled to such notice, whether before or after the time stated therein, shall be equivalent to the giving of such notice.

AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE VII Section 3 (page 11) Section 3. The Trustees shall meet at least once each calendar year between August 1 and November 30, and, in their discretion, more often as the Trustees deem necessary, to review the condition of the Fund. 

#### **PRE-PLANNING**

Pre-arrangement is the act of planning a funeral service prior to the time it is needed. Today, more people are recognizing that planning ahead provides peace of mind and demonstrates consideration for the families. Pre-arrangement is a thoughtful decision that helps reduce the stress of indecision and uncertainty when a death occurs. It is also a natural part of estate-planning decisions, such as creating wills and trusts.

Pre-planning for funerals and choosing cemetery gravesites or mausoleum vaults are sensitive topics that most individuals and families rarely speak of until the need arises. All too often, when a loved one dies, surviving family members are not prepared to decide important questions of funeral and burial. What preferences would our loved one have for funeral preparations? What kind of funeral would he/she want? Where should he/she be buried? Where is the money coming from to pay funeral expenses?

These and other concerns can be eliminated when we make prearrangements. The family has comfort in knowing that plans made are plans desired by the deceased.

Neveh Shalom owns and operates two cemeteries: One at Neveh Zedek off Canyon Lane and one at Ahavai Shalom off Terwilliger Blvd. Both have been around since the late 1890's. Both Cemeteries are well-cared for and a beautiful, peaceful place to be returned to the earth based on Genesis 3:19... "where God informs Adam he shall return to dust." As a member of Neveh Shalom, each individual is entitled to a burial plot at either cemetery, and the burial fees can be pre-paid. 

that Jesus was the messiah, that he was already here, and that he will one day return. The New Testament asserts this claim by identifying Jesus as King David's legacy. In fact, the name "Christians" and the word "Christos" are Greek translations of the word "Messiah."

Mordechi Kaplan, the great Conservative rabbi who later founded the Reconstructionist Movement, did not view the messiah as a literal person but instead proclaimed that the messiah was a symbol of humanity's potential: "We can no longer believe that any person or semi-divine being is divinely destined to rule as the Messiah and usher in the millennium. Nevertheless, the idea of the Messiah can still figure symbolically to express the valid belief in the coming of a higher type of humanity than this world has yet known." The messianic age is a utopian ideal, a time of blessing and bliss; a time when the ancient prophets' dreams of universal peace become manifest. Because our world knows too well of pain and atrocity we look towards the messianic age, a future time that knows only justice and shalom.

Perhaps the messiah is said to be born on T'isha B'Av precisely because it is a day that remembers a world shattered in chaos. From T'isha B'Av we move towards the High Holy Days which call upon us to begin a process of fixing and re-building our personal and universal world. The cycle of our holiday calendar expresses the hope for the messianic age of harmony. It is a model for the eventual redemption of our world. Partnering with God, the One who cannot be put into words, we act to move from brokenness towards wholeness, ushering in the age of ultimate peace.

### NOTES FROM SHOMREI TEVA

#### Bal Tashchit: Do Not Waste

Bal Tashchit is often considered the core of Jewish environmental teaching. The term, stated in Devarim (Deuteronomy) 20:19-20, literally means "do not destroy" and was originally a prohibition against cutting down fruit trees in time of war. The Rabbis studied and debated this principle, and eventually extended it with the reasoning that "if it is forbidden to harm the natural environment during wartime, a life-or-death situation, then how much more so regarding day-to-day situations of personal comfort and economic profit and loss?". (This last is taken from an excellent new book in our synagogue library: *The Way Into Judaism and the Environment* by Jeremy Benstein. I highly recommend it to all members.)

How can you and I follow the rule of Bal Tashchit, especially in August, this month's Chronicle? Since this is Oregon's dry season, and water is precious here too, what can we do to conserve water?

There are many good ideas at the Portland Water Bureau's website, which includes a page of Tips at: http://www.portlandonline.com/water/index.cfm?c=29594. In summer, it's especially useful to look at the Outdoor Conservation Tips. See what you can do to save water in this very dry season as a way to live more Jewishly, in concert with our great principle of Bal Tashchit.


