Dear Friends,

Welcome to a new year of learning, connection, and growth at Congregation Neveh Shalom. As we open the pages of this year's program guide, we also open ourselves to the sacred possibility of community, tradition, and transformation.

Our theme for 5786 is drawn from a powerful phrase in the Book of Exodus: Na'aseh v'Nishma — "We will do, and we will listen." These words, spoken by the Israelites at Sinai, express a uniquely Jewish approach to spiritual growth. We act, and then we understand. We try, and then we reflect. Judaism is not just a religion of belief—it is a living tradition of practice, dialogue, and discovery.

This year, we invite you to embrace action and learn through listening. Whether it's joining a minyan, volunteering for a mitzvah project, participating in adult education, attending a family Shabbat,



or sitting in sacred conversation with one another, each step we take brings Torah to life. We believe that learning happens not only in classrooms but in sanctuaries, kitchens, parks, and Zoom squares. Listening is not only about hearing others but about noticing the wisdom within ourselves and our tradition.

You'll see this theme woven throughout our programs—from youth and family offerings, to adult education, to social justice initiatives, holiday celebrations, and beyond. Each experience is an invitation to say "yes" to Jewish life—sometimes before we know exactly where it will lead. Like our ancestors at Sinai, we trust that by doing, we come to deeper understanding.

In a world that often rushes us toward certainty, Judaism gives us space to grow, ask questions, and act with purpose. At Neveh Shalom, we do that together—as a kehillah kedosha, a sacred community.

We are so glad you're here. May this year's journey of na'aseh v'nishma lead us all to a deeper sense of belonging, meaning, and joy.

Bris/Baby Naming

Jewish tradition has beautiful ways to commemorate life cycle events, starting from the very beginning of life. Our clergy and staff are here to help with the details to create a beautiful ceremony for you and your (newly expanded) family.

Brit Milah/Bris: A brit milah, often called a bris, is the traditional 8th-day circumcision for boys. The bris can be held at a home or in the synagogue. To learn more about resources at CNS, please contact our clergy assistant, receptionist@nevehshalom.org

Simchat Bat/Baby Naming: Usually called a simchat bat ("rejoicing in the daughter"), a baby naming for a girl can take on the form and timing that's best for the family. Talk with our clergy and staff to determine the details.

The bar/bat/brit mitzvah year is an amazing milestone for our youth and their families. We offer planning support and prepare students to lead prayers with confidence and comprehension.

If you're requesting *tahara* for your loved one (respectful preparation for burial according to ancient Jewish tradition) you may request it from either Holman's Funeral Home at 503-232-5131; Riverview Funeral Service at 503-246-6488; or the funeral home of your choice. The funeral home will then notify the *chevra kadisha* (individuals who help with the burial process).

Our Values

Foundation School is based on the ideals and traditions of the Jewish faith and is dedicated to providing exceptional early childhood education. While our curriculum is centered on the foundations of Jewish learning, our program is open to all.

We value play as every child's natural way of learning and view each child as a competent and unique learner. Our qualified and experienced staff encourages the growth of the whole child -- intellectual, social, emotional, physical, and spiritual. We encourage the development of each child's creativity, curiosity and character through respectful and age-appropriate practices alongside an emergent curriculum.

For nearly 70 years, we have embraced our youngest learners – sparking imaginations, instilling a sense of wonder, and providing the building blocks for the next generation of creative and confident problem-solvers. We lovingly support the very youngest members of our *kehilah* ("community") during the most formative years of their lives. We meet children where they are developmentally, and we explore Judaism using all our senses, for a beautifully holistic experience.

Educational Approach

Foundation School is inspired by the Reggio Emilia educational philosophy. We see our students as infinitely capable, and as such, our teachers collaborate with students to create meaningful and relevant curriculum that inspires the particular group of learners in each classroom community. We believe it is our task to teach our students to be able citizens of our community who have the skills to be independent learners, kind friends, and advocates for themselves as they gain readiness for kindergarten and the world beyond.

Our teachers take time to document each child's process of learning. As we take photos of the children engaged in activity, write down their words, and display them for the community to see, they begin to understand that their ideas and words have power. Teachers structure the environment to help children expand their academic and social potential, encouraging discovery and meaningful learning in developmentally appropriate ways.

ALIYAH K-6

Now more than ever, it is important for our children to grow up with a strong sense of Jewish connection, identity and history. The warm community of ALIYAH Jewish learning provides engaging, high-level learning opportunities for every student. Our students experience Jewish holidays and traditions, gain strong Hebrew language skills, and grow from the many opportunities for meaningful leadership within the congregational community. Our teachers are dynamic and nurturing, and our kids enjoy their experience of Jewish education. Our highest goal is for our children to feel at home in Judaism, by gaining literacy about our traditions, and experiences that ignite curiosity and connection.

Judaics & Electives

On Sunday mornings, all K-6 children attend an experiential, social, content-rich Judaics program. Each grade has its own curricular topic of exploration, a specific mitzvah or Jewish value to practice, and various chugim (electives) such as music, art, cooking, book-lovers, and super-hero comic-writing. Parents and grandparents are invited to family programs to share in their child's learning and connect with our community.





Hebrew

Our students learn Hebrew at their own pace with an individual Hebrew tutor, 30 minutes per week, in person or on zoom. Our students participate in setting goals for their own learning, and parents are invited to conferences twice per year to celebrate their child's progress.



Inclusion

ALIYAH is an inclusive community that welcomes students across the spectrum of learning styles and needs. We work closely with families to create individualized learning plans as necessary and celebrate the achievements of each of our students based on their own abilities. We learn throughout our program that every individual has strengths and challenges and the beauty of a community is that we all gain from supporting each other.

YOUTH EDUCATION

Tichon (High School)

7th-12th graders stay engaged in Jewish learning and social life through our ALIYAH Tichon (high school) program on Wednesday evenings. Teens come for dinner together and stay for learning and conversation in classes that they choose and help decide.

- A Taste of Jewish Culture—Cooking, eating, and discussing foods from around the Jewish World.
- The Golem Project: Power, Protection, Projection, and Peril—Explore the long, strange history of the Golem through stories, graphic novels, video, discussion, and creative projects!
